GENERAL SMUTS AT THE FRONT.

South Africa's Premier and Commander in Chief is setting off by plane for a visit to the Springboks at the front. A strenuous week of continuous travelling in which his longest period of rest was four hours, is typical of the almost tireless energy of General Smuts. Twenty five years ago he was leading the fathers of these men in a similar campaign. Today he leads another generation and in his own words "They are worthy of the rock from whence they were hewn".
