ROOSEVELT LIBRARY INAUGURATED

At Hyde Park, New York, is one of the most historic libraries in the world. It's the Roosevelt Library and it cost 350,000 dollars to build and equip. The President's Room, the centre of a number of apartments that houses private papers, records, parchments and booklets covering the momentous years of his political life since 1910. Family portraits are on the wall and there are models of ships and other kinds that help to tell the story of American progress. A large effigy of the President in a sphinx like setting is a dominating figure. Besides family paintings there are life size figures of Mr. and Mrs. Today a crowd gathers for the dedicating ceremony. The priceless records of thirty years, thirty strenuous and very stormy years, are to be formerly handed over by the man who made them.
