In Octoberclast year the first American Eagle Squadren was formed in this Country. Meet some of the Pilets (and their mascot) of the Second Squadren now operating as unit of the R.A.F. Fighter Command. These Americans have already taken part in a number of sweeps over the Channel and in Convey Patrol Duties. Many of them were civilian pilets in the States, but wartime flying presented an epportunity which they couldn't resist, so they made tracks to the nearest recruiting centre and enlisted in the ever-growing ranks of the American Eagled.

It is British Policy to preserve the national entity of the airmen who are fighting with the R.A.F. They therefore function as separate squadrens within the framework of a fighting service which has grown to magnificent strength in the fiery furnace of war.
