

NEW WAR CABINET.

We present a portrait gallery of the new War Cabinet.

Mr. Churchill's deputy as Prime Minister is Mr. Clement Attlee, Secretary of State for the Dominions. The former Lord Privy Seal is succeeded by Sir Stafford Cripps who becomes also leader of the House of Commons. There is no change affecting Sir John Anderson who still remains Lord President of the Council.

The youngest member of the War Cabinet, Mr. Anthony Eden continues in office as Secretary for Foreign Affairs. Mr. Oliver Lyttleton continues as Minister of State exercising general supervision over production. Linked closely with production is, of course, manpower and Mr. Ernest Bevin remains Minister of Labour. ~~Depart~~

Departures from the War Cabinet include forceful Lord Beaverbrook, who will go to America to carry on the work he has already begun. Sir Kingsley Wood, Chancellor of the Exchequer (With Mr. Arthur Greenwood,) remains Cabinet but not War Cabinet Rank.

Public opinion appears to welcome these changes in Mr. Churchill's War Cabinet. Strong men will receive strong support from the Country - we wish them well.
