RED ARMY ANNIVERSARY.

The Anthem of Britain and the Allies precede the speeches of the big public meeting in London in celebration of the 24th Anniversary of the Red Army. Tributes to the splendid achievements of the Soviet forces are made as Premier Stalin in Moscow launches the great Soviet birthday attack on the Nazis. Chairman at the London gathering is Mr. Frank Owen, the first speaker.

"We are here to celebrate an anniversary which will echo down through history. Twenty four years ago today the Red Army was first called into its honourable existence - it was born out of the first world war and out of the agony of a great revolution. One generation has passed and now the world is at war again with German Militarism. And we here today resolve to give all that is within the power of man, to pay the debt the Red Army has laid upon all mankind".

"We come to pay a tribute to those who have died and to those comrades who have yet to die, that England and Russia may live".

"Ladies and Gentlemen, and may I say comrades. I wanted to say that particular word to you because, as you know, I fought and took a fairly big part in the last war. There I met and had to deal with millions of Englishmen. They were called soldiers, but they were Englishmen. They were just citizens of our own great country. And they were my comrades... and I think they all feel, they all feel today, those who are alive today, that I am their comrade. And ladies and gentlemen, we shall never, not only win this war but win this peace, unless we are Comrades".
