CYPRUS ON THE ALERT.

Shipyards everywhere have never known such a time as the present.

"We must have more ships off the slipways" is the demand. Just how some are taking the water is the subject of our story. At Norfolk, Virginia, they're launching sideways the all-welded steel hull of this oil tanker over a six foot drop. A very near thing to capsizing, but she makes it.

In South Africa, Durban builds its first Warship - a forty five ton anti-submarine vessel. Fellowing the christening ceremony, a giant crane lifts the boat bedily off its stocks, and swinging it neatly across the wharf, lowers it into the water.
