THEIR MAJESTIES IN NORTHERN IRELAND.

Their Majesties arrive in Northern Ireland aboard H.M.S. PHOEBE. Upon landing at Belfast the royal visitors are introduced to British and American Officers before proceeding to a big camp, where General Hartle escorts them around the mechanised units assembled on the parade ground. Later, the King and Queen, with Mr. John Winant witness a march past of troops wearing full battle kit, and which also included a demonstration of American drill by a section of Infantry. This is followed with a display by an armoured formation.

The visit is marked by the absence of stiff-fronted formalities. A pleasing aspect which is heightened by the fact that when the King and Queen move from one section of the camp to another, they travel in the now familiar "Jeeps". The Royal visit to the A.E.F. in Northern Ireland illustrates Their Majesties friendly regard for the men of our great Ally.
