AMERICA CHEERS WAR HEROES.

A wildly excited and cheering crowd of New Yorkers pack Broadway as down the City's great highway the fifteen selected war heroes - ten of them British - start a tour of the United States.

Now to Washington where, at the White House, President Roosevelt, the most accessible man of State, receives the men who have been honoured for heroism and sacrifice. Heroes whose names are linked with the history-making attacks and battles which range from Lubeck; from Pearl Harbour to the Phillipines.
