

THE GREAT ALASKA HIGHWAY.

We are at the start of the great Alaska Highway; the beginning of a sixteen hundred mile engineering masterpiece. For over a year work has been going steadily ahead along the route which starts in the Province of Alberta, and penetrates the Yukon to Alaska.
