TRAIN DISASTER

Flaming railroad crash-up that cost a score of lives, three trains wrecked, two passenger limiteds and a fast freight. Flames of fuel oil of diesel locomotive spread rapidly and hampers the rescue work. The disaster occurred when the Detroit express hurled a rear Pullman at the east-bound Cleveland Limited side-ways into a freight on the west-bound track. It was the first train accident involving injury to passengers on this railroad in 23 years. Piling up in a mountain pass, 15 box-cars loaded with oil line pipes splintered and tangled like a steel log jam blocking traffic on a vital main line to the nation's capital.
