FIRST contingent of men of the 8th Army, wounded at El Alamein, Knightsbridge and other places in the Libyan Desert, arrive at a large military hospital in the North West. Many of them have served overseas for more than three years and were veterans of Dunkirk, Greece and Crete before the great Battle of Egypt.
