BLAZING SHIP SCUTTLED.

AMAZING NIGHT PICTURES.

Picture .: - To save this ship from complete destruction,

to be seuttled. It is a Greek vessel, of three-thousand tons, deck-loaded with Espato grass, now an infermo.

Safe removal of ten threatened timbered ships has just been achieved, after a secreting

ordeal for those who save the ships. Electric

drills are now cutting a hele in the doomed vessel's side to sink her. This

drastic method is the only one which will prevent an explosion and subdue the flames which are a menace to the Liverpool river-side.

At last the drills have out through her red-hot plates, and

water is pumped into the hull. In pouring rain, our cameramen

stood by all night to secure dawn pictures of the submerged, but still burning ship. The river is not

deep enough to completely cover her, so our operator, like Casabianea,

stood on the burning deck and turned his

cine camera, as the ship went down. Heroic fire-fighting has averted a dock-side calamity.
