RECALLED TO HIS THRONE.

the time being, has invited King George of Greece to take his throne again. A little Greek girl

presents His Majesty with a posy of flowers, just as he leaves his hotel for Victoria Station. Compatriots

of the King have assembled in their hundreds to give him their good wishes. In the midst of this crowd several members of our Royal Family are waiting to bid their royal friend of eleven years adieu.

The Prince of Wales,

the Duke and Duchess of York, the Duke and Duchess of Kent, and Prince Paul of Greece, the Grecian King's brother and heir, make a distinguished group

on the station platform. Last royal farewells are given and received, and the King of

Greece, makes his first step homeward to take

his rightful place as head of his people. The noise of the train is drowned by cheers from the London Greek colony.

At Dover still more people cheer His Majesty on his way. He is accompanied on this triumphant return by Prince Paul, his brother, Admiral Papanigopoulos, his aide-de-camps, and Major Levidid, his personal equerry. His Majesty said "I shall ever cherish the most pleasant memories of Great Britain, and of the unfailing courtesy and kindness which I have met there."
