NUMEROUS DEPUTATIONS.

The City Marshal, Lieutenant-Commander Poland precedes the semi-state

coach. It is the new Marshal's first public appearance in his official capacity.

Mr. Baldwin leaves No.10, Downing Street for the same destination, with his state

robes following behind him. The occasion is

the King's reception of various public bodies,

and His Majesty himself drives from York House to the Palace

to receive the loyal and dutiful addresses from said public bodies. The addresses set

forth the citizens' condolences

on the death of King George, and congratulations to His Majesty on his accession

to the throne. For this state occasion the Lord Mayor wears his scarlet gown and the Aldermen their civic robes, but His Majesty reduces the formality of the occasion by wearing ordinary morning clothes. Five-hundred representatives of twenty public institutions attended, and to each

of the addresses, the King made a personal reply.
