ZATOPEK'S RECORD.

In the Colombes Stadium in Paris, the famous Olympic distance runner from Czechoslovakia, Emil Zatopek, took part in the International Meeting. He was nearly a non-starter --- because only at the last minute was he granted a visa. But --- taking part in the 5,000 metres --- the great Zatopek once again gave a tremendous display, and soon lapped the rest of the field. Zatopek covered the 5,000 metres in ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ thirteen minutes, fifty-seven and two tenths seconds --- beating the world record of Gundar Haegg set up in 1942.
