underground tunnels carry the river water below the city at the rate

of fifteen million gallens a minute.

Another royal eccasion of the week took place in Scotland

Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother, arrived at the Kelvin Hall,

Glasgew, to open the Scottish Industries Exhibition

After the opening ceremony the Chairman of the Exhibition presented to Her Majesty an antique teapet and maxer salver. It had been made by a Glasgow silversmith more than two hundred years age.

And then the Queen Mother made a tour of the Exhibition.....
where a hundred different industries were represented. Some of the stands had an almost futuristic look; others went back to the past --- to the days of the Victorian effice girl who was known, as often as not, as the lady typewriter.
