After a four-week held-up during which over three hundred ships have lain idle, Britain's docks have once more come to life as the dockers return to work. The strike had anvolved as many as ferty-feur thousand men and spread to eight perts. It was the worst stoppage for nearly ten years. Now --- happily --- cranes and derricks and hoeks are busy again, and experts and impar imports valued at some two hundred millions are on the meve.

Pictures taken at the Reyal Albert Dock show that, fellowing this strike on the question of evertime, evertime is being worked to clear off arrears. Britain's two-way flow of its lifeblood.
