Fellowing a summer almost universally cold and wet --- stories of flood damage in Europe begin th hit the headlines. Terrential rainstorms in the Athlene district of Ireland have flooded the River Shannon; in this district alone, more than twenty square miles lie beneath the water. A further downpour of twenty-four hours, made these worst floods for thirty years.

But this disaster in Irela d is overshadewed by the news from Italy --- where floods and landslides have wrought dist have unparalleled. Near Salerne, several small villages have been almost wiped out.

Soldiers have been hurried to the sceme to take charge of rescue work; but nearly all means of communication n--- reads, weilways and telephones --- have been cut off. First estimates gave the number of killed as well over two hundred; many hundreds of families have been driven from home.
