Now --- four times finalists in the last six years --- Bishop Auckland have a go. Here comes their No. 1 goal, from Derek Lewin

Bishop Auckland --- spurred on by their success --- now turned on the pressure

A shot at goal was saved by Hendon's goalkeeper, Ivey. But he fumbled it.

And Lewin scored No. 2. for the Bishops

Now the match was safely in the bag --- but al though Bishop Auckland kept on the offensive, the scored stayed put at two goals to nil. But that was enough to give them the Amateur Cup for 1955 --- presented by Field Marshal Montgomery.

Another sporting event of **Sector** London was the National Road Relay Race from London to Brighton --- sponsored by the News of the World. Eleven relays for a total of approximately fifty-five miles. And here is the first change-over --- at Clapham. The oldest competitor was forty-five-year-old Charlie Smart of Belgrave Harriers; and one of the world-famous was Gordon Pirie, running for South kandh London..... and leading the field on the long No. 7 stage of nearly seven miles.

The race was won in the record time of four hours twenty-nine minutes nineteen seconds --- giving victory to South London for second year in succession.
