

AUSTRIAN TREATY SIGNED IN VIENNA.

17/5/55.

At the Belvedere Palace ~~in Vienna~~ --- formerly a home of the Emperors of Austria --- Foreign Ministers ~~of the Great Powers~~ arrived to sign the Treaty which restored ~~in~~ Sovereignty to the Austria of to-day. Mr Molotov was the representative of the Soviet Union. For Great Britain --- in the place so long occupied by Sir Anthony Eden --- Foreign Minister Mr MacMillan.

Mr Foster Dulles, Secretary of State, was here to sign on behalf of the Government of the United States. And M. Pinay was here for France.

First to sign the seventy-page treaty, was Russia's Mr Molotov --- who said later that this solution reached on the problems of Austria, could be a symbol for all other international problems. It was at this meeting of the Foreign Ministers, that Russia ~~announced~~ announced her readiness to take part in the meeting of the leaders of the Great Powers of East and West. For Austria --- this was a day of rejoicing..... and freedom that she has not known, since Hitler marched in seventeen years ago.

Also from Vienna in the same despatch, comes a meeting of the world of sport --- the Davis Cup. Tie between Austria, and Great Britain. This was the opening singles between Huber of Austria --- that's Huber --- and Becker.

Now it's Roger Becker of Great Britain at the far end. Huber won the first set 6 - 4. But in the second set Becker was only beaten at 9 - 7..... and the third he took from the Austrian 6 - love.

Huber won the last set 6 - 4 --- and the match.

In the doubles --- Austria were represented by H. Redl and ~~KxxKxx~~ Huber, when the singles stood at one match all. The British pair they had to meet, were Tony Mottram and Geoffrey Paish.

Now it's Great Britain at the far end. ~~Mottram and Paish won this match~~ THEY WON in three straight sets; --- and two more singles wins, gave a second round victory to Great Britain.
