Oslo was a city of excited anticipation, when the Royal Yacht Britannia brought Queen Elizabeth and the Duke of Edingurgh to Norway, for their three-day state visit. Waiting to greet them on the pier of honour, were King Haakon and other members of the royal family, including grandchildren Prince Harald and Princess Astrid. And there were cheers from the crowd of many thousands, as the Queen walked among them with her host --- still upright and active, despite his more than eighty years.

On the quayside, a guard of honour was mounted by the King's Guard.

Her Majesty and the Duke took part in a ceremony decomposition.

And it was also at the Folk Museum, that Norwegian children, in their pictures que native costume, gave a display of traditional dancing.

Another event in a busy programme, was a garden party at the Embassy for members of the British Commonwealth who live in Norway.

And the day ended brilliantly when the Queen, wearing the sash of the Order of the Garter, attended a gala performance at Oslo's National Theatre.

Then --- once again at the pier of honour --- the Queen was escorted by King Haakon, as she said farewell to the people of Norway who had given her such a friendly welcome.
