Closing stages of the Tennis Championships at Wimbledon saw Princess Margaret and the Duchess of Kent, take their places among the spectators on the Centre Court to watch the final of the Men's Singles..... ~~between~~ Tony Trabert of America, on the left, who was seeded Number 1 ----- and Kurt Nielsen of Denmark, who was not seeded at all.

Well --- here they go. It's Trabert at the far end.

Now it's Nielsen serving.

Trabert won the first set, 6 - 3.

And so Tony Trabert won the last set 6 - 1 --- and the Championship.

As Her Royal Highness the Duchess of Kent --- President of the All-England Lawn Tennis Club, came on the court to congratulate the ~~finalists~~ ^{WINNER} --- the absence of a British player from the scene was tempered by Britain's triumph in the Ladies' Doubles.

Then The Duchess presented the ^{GOLD} Cup ^{AWD} to Tony Trabert ---, by not losing a single set throughout the Championship, equalled the 1938 record of Donald Budge; --- and became one of the great ones of Wimbledon.
