

In this plane was the first representative of Queen Elizabeth to fly over the icy wilderness of the North Pole. Governor-General Vincent Massey of Canada, landing at an Eskimo camp at Hall Lake, was ~~at the camp~~, presented with a gift of walrus tusks. At Cambridge Bay, during this ten-thousand mile Arctic Tour, Mr Massey watched Eskimo children fishing through holes in the ice; but though he tried it himself for twenty-minutes in sub-zero weather, he was unable to equal the success of the children of the North Pole.

At an Eskimo snow-house in Cambridge Bay, the visitor from Ottawa was regaled with a drum dance; --- ~~and~~ many of the performers and spectators had travelled scores of miles by dog-team to be present. Their hardihood was matched by that of the visitor; for the Governor-General, at sixty-nine, had come to meet them at the end of a journey, that might well be considered too hard and hazardous for many a man half his age.
