Completing two months of magnificent response, the Lord Mayor of London, Sir Cullum Welch, received for his Hungarian and Central European Relief Fund scheque from the Lord Mayor of Birmingham. And at this same brief ceremony in the London Mansion House, the Lord Mayor received cheques from representatives of the Film Industry, which amounted to a total of seventy-eight thousand pounds and which brought the total amount of the Fund up to the target figure of two millions. These cheques the more clearly than any words how generously you the cinemagners of Britain or answered the appeal for the stricken people of Hungary.

Time over

In Washington --- the eighty-fifth Congresss of the United States opened as a usual with a speech from the President; and Mr Eisenhower included in his address to the members of both Houses a special message to the leaders of the Soviet Union.
