BAILEY BRIDGE.

The famous Bailey Bridge --- first used in Italy and Tunisia in the Second World War --- has been given a peacetime job in the ~~xxxx~~ streets of the city of London. On a corner site in Hobborn Circus, it has been erected, as a temporary replacement of a small road, during building operations. It ~~xxxx~~ spans a sixty-foot gap. Its main purpose will be to serve as a route in cases of emergency ~~xxxx~~ <sup>20</sup>3

GERMAN MINE.

London had another reminder of the war years when a German mine was found on the bed of the West India Dock in Limehouse. A Royal Navy Bomb Disposal Unit, <sup>8</sup> under Lt. Commander Guttridge, dealt with it in the careful, but apparently <sup>CASUAL</sup> manner that became so familiar in Britain after many a night's blitz. It was a parachute mine of a somewhat unusual type. It was taken to Shoeburyness to be exploded out of harm's way. <sup>23</sup>7

ALGIERS OPERATIONS.

N Helicopters were used for transporting French troops in Algeria, as part of a big operation against rebels in the region of Teniet El Haad. <sup>8</sup>4

One of the objectives was a mountain cave --- from which ~~xx~~ prisoners were captured and also a quantity of arms and ammunition. Shortly afterwards, the district was reported to be under control <sup>10</sup>5

PRINCESS CAROLINE.

In Monaco, the first important ceremony in the life of the new Princess took place in the ~~xxxx~~ drawing room of the Palace, in the presence of Prince Rainier and members of his family, and of ~~xxx~~ ~~xxxx~~ Princess Grace's mother, Mrs Kelly from America.
