This is Glorious Twelfth --- training at Mr Renton's stables at Ripon. Unfortunately, on the day of our visit, exercise was limited owing to frozen ground.

Now, in the paddick at Sandown, we find Sundew --- a 1956 victim of Becker's. Also Mr Lawrence's Rose Park, who won the Gainsborough Chase.

Now --- in Ireland --- Sam Browthorn, who disappointed at Leopardstown. Another entry --- from ~~[unclear]~~ Irish stables, is Fahrenheit.

Ireland's Virginus was also disappointing at Gowran Park.

Big surprise among the National Probables racing at Leopardstown was Tutto --- an outsider from Paddy Pollard's stables at Ballinure who won by a comfortable <sup>four</sup> ~~five~~ lengths in the Leopardstown Chase.

Sandy Jane created a good impression recently at Gowran Park --- leading ~~[unclear]~~ all the way to romp home easily by nine lengths.

Going back to last year's Grand National --- here's Madame Hennessey's Armorial III, ridden by Fulke Walwyn and leading at the halfway mark --- but brought down at Jump No. 26.
